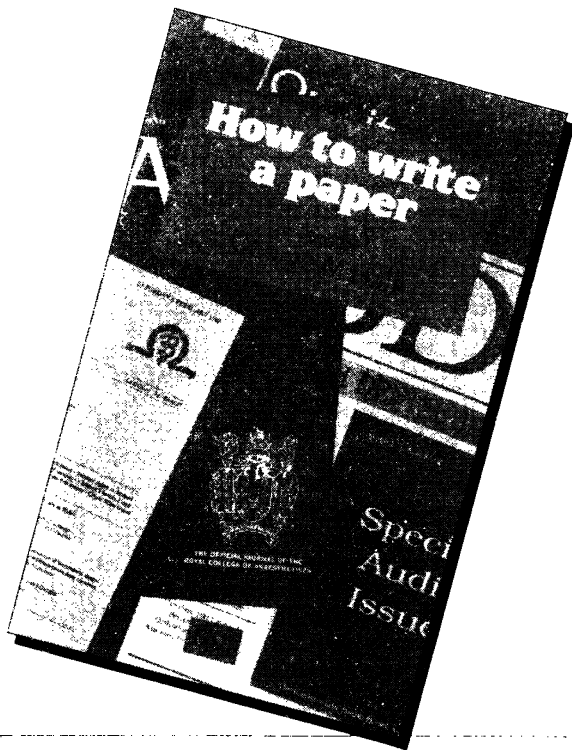


WANT TO GET YOUR PAPERS PUBLISHED? Read this first!
